- .Weightages of various Assessments

TERM 1: FA1 (10%) +FA2 (10%) + SA1(30%)=50%

TERM 2:FA3 (10%)+FA 4(10%)+SA2(30%)=50%

- Scholastic Subjects will be assessed on a 10 point scale and Co-scholastic subjects on a 5 point scale
- Upgradation Policy (followed by CBSE ONLY)
- PASS CRITERION: A student must secure at least 45/180 marks in SA1+SA2(90+90=180 marks) In other words ,he/she must secure 25% out of 60 %[SA1(30%)+SA2(30%)] and 33% in aggregate in every subject to qualify for promotion to Class X. The student must get a minimum grade 'D' in both scholastic & Co-scholastic subjects respectively.
- ASL in English will be conducted once in every Term.  
Speaking(20 marks)+Listening test(20 marks)=40 marks  
Calculation for ASL:40/2=20 MARKS
- The material for ASL is given by CBSE.
- The question papers and the marking schemes for SA1 & SA2 are provided by CBSE TO PRINCIPALS ONLY.
- A section of OTBA (Open Text Book Assessment) is there in every subject, except Sanskrit in SA2.  
This section is of 10 marks. The two themes of every subject are uploaded on the CBSE website. The teachers explain both the themes to the students before SA2
- Teachers will ensure that the students are not over burdened with too many activities. Interdisciplinary projects will be given more importance.

Parents to ensure that their wards should

1. Submit the assignments/ projects etc. on time
2. Come to school on time and in proper uniform
3. not carry mobile phones to school
4. Not drive any vehicle.

The programme was concluded with an open discussion and clarification of the problems/ doubts of the parents.
